# Review: Mukurtu CMS 101

- Mukurtu is about providing ACCESS
- Communities
  - o the WHO: grouping site contributors
- Cultural Protocols
  - the HOW: how should content be shared? defining access at multiple levels for communities [linked]
- Categories
  - the WHAT: subjects that make sense to your site users (10-15) -- keywords are in addition to these



# Mukurtu: Media

- Media library (admin view)
  - Holds your access copies
- Upload media assets
  - Multiple file types for: documents, audio, video and images
- Media assets + embedded metadata
  - Title, Protocol, and Author (ie--who uploaded it)
  - Stay with the item throughout the site

# Mukurtu: Digital Heritage Items

- DH items can have more than 1 media asset
  DH items tell a whole story
- FIVE metadata tabs
  - Mukurtu Essential & Mukurtu Core
  - Provide sharing settings at DH item level
    - Our Unique to Mukurtu:
      - +Cultural Narratives & Traditional Knowledge
      - +Related Items, Community Records
- ADD as MUCH as you can!



# Mukurtu Mobile

- Content collection tool
  - Maintains your sites protocols, communities and categories
  - Record on-the-go
    - Images, audio, video (need YouTube account)
    - Content associated with places
  - Engage community members
    - Add to your site in real time or later
    - Edit once you are back to your site

#### DESCRIPTION:

The Chalcraft-Pickering Photograph Collection (1862 - 1941) includes 105 family portraits and 3 boxes of lantern slides. This collection is a selection of glass lantern slides depicting scenes of the grounds, buildings and students at Chemawa, an Indian Training School near Salem, Oregon, Included are classroom scenes, sports, music, and work activities of the students. The slides are assumed to be the work of Edwin L. Chalcraft and bear his descriptive notes along the binding tape.





# **DESCRIPTION:**

ajurrujurru (bean tree, batswing coral tree; Erythrina vespertilio)

Grows on the side of the hills and along creeks. Women go out in two or three toyotas to the countryside to collect the seeds from the ground around the trees. When they have finished, they drive back to the town or community. They make a fire and put a long piece of wire in the fire to make it hot. They put the seeds on the board. Then the women pick up the wire from the fire and burn a hole through them. They put the seeds with holes in them to one side. When they finish putting holes through the seeds, they put a string through the holes to makes necklaces and bangles. The wood of this tree is also used for making coolamons and fighting sticks.

jitarna (northern corkwood; Hakea Chordophylla)

Jitarna grows in many places, including the sand country. It is bush medicine. You can cut the bark and burn it till it's black, then scrape the black off. Your grind it fine and mix it up with hard fat. If you have scabies or burns, you rub it all over your body until it's black, or if you have gumboils you put it in your mouth on the gum. You can also mix it up with hard fat and put it around your mouth to make a fake moustache. The bark can also be boiled until it turns the water red. You can use this to wash sores, boils and skin rashes. The tree flowers from August to September. You can suck the flowers for nectar.
